



of a foster home in the process of licensure, when in fact Respondent had not reviewed the home for needed corrections. Further, the complaint alleged that Respondent had altered the dates on a form signed by the foster parents. Respondent received a Formal Censure from the Board for this misconduct.

3. Respondent was terminated from her employment. Subsequently, the supervisor provided information to the Board in March of 2012 regarding her discovery that a copy of her own signature had been taped to a form by the Respondent as though the supervisor had approved the report.

4. Respondent was informed of the new information, and in March of 2012 the Board received Respondent's tender of her surrendered Kansas social worker license.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

5. Respondent has committed unprofessional conduct in violation of K.S.A. 65-6311.

6. K.S.A. 74-7508(e) grants the Board "the power to revoke the license ... of any licensee ... who voluntarily surrenders such person's license ... pending investigation of misconduct or while charges of misconduct against the licensee are pending or anticipated."

7. The Committee finds that the public cannot be adequately protected while Respondent Anderson has a license to practice social work in Kansas.

**SANCTION**

In light of the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Committee unanimously finds that the Kansas Bachelor Social Worker License of Respondent Regina Anderson should be, and is hereby, revoked.


