SUMMARY PROCEEDING ORDER OF SUSPENSION

Now, on this 18 day of May, 2023, the above-captioned matter comes before the Complaint Review Committee of the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board ("Board").

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds that the following facts have been established by a preponderance of the evidence:

1. Sara E. Wood ("Licensee") was at all times relevant, a Licensed Master Social Worker ("LMSW") within the meaning of the Kansas Social Workers Licensure Act, K.S.A. 65-6301, *et seq.*, and amendments thereto. The Board issued Licensee's original LMSW No. 10746 on approximately January 19, 2018. Licensee's LMSW license was set to expire on January 31, 2022.
2. On January 28, 2022, Licensee submitted to the Board her renewal application.
3. On or about January 31, 2022, Board staff notified Licensee that her LMSW license was randomly selected for an audit. As part of the audit, Licensee was to submit to the Board documentation for the Continuing Education Units ("CEUs") claimed as part of her renewal.
4. On March 1, 2022, Licensee had not provided the Board with the requested documentation. Board staff sent a second message to Licensee on this date, requesting documentation necessary to process Licensee's renewal.
5. On July 6, 2022, Licensee had not provided the Board with the requested documentation. Board staff sent a third message to Licensee on this date, stating that Licensee must comply with the audit within 30 days, or a Report of Alleged Violation would be filed against her by the Board.

6. On August 26, 2022, Licensee had not contacted Board staff, so Board investigators filed a Report of Alleged Violation against Licensee for failing to comply with the license renewal audit.

7. On August 30, 2022, Board investigators sent a message to Licensee, requesting a written response to the Report of Alleged Violation no later than September 30, 2022.

8. On October 25, 2022, Licensee had not contacted Board investigators. On this date, Board investigators sent another message to Licensee requesting a response in writing no later than November 25, 2022.

9. On October 28, 2022, Licensee sent a message to Board investigators concerning the complaint. Licensee stated that when she was selected for audit, she realized that she was 3 hours short of the required 6 continuing education hours in diagnosis and treating. Licensee stated that she decided to "let her license go" but did not communicate this intention to the Board nor contacted the Board concerning the audit. In her October 28 message, Licensee provided additional information concerning changing jobs to a position that did not require her LMSW license and that she had moved out-of-state. Licensee stated that she would like to comply with the audit if she was still able to do so.

10. On October 31, 2022, Board staff provided an audit packet for Licensee to complete with additional instructions. Licensee sent a message to Board staff on this date, indicating Licensee's intention to provide the necessary information.

11. On January 16, 2023, Licensee sent a message to Board staff, stating that she would not be completing the audit.

12. To date, Licensee has failed to provide necessary information as part of her attempted 2022 LMSW license renewal.

APPLICABLE LAW

13. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537(a) of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act ("KAPA"), a state agency may use summary proceedings, subject to a party's request for a hearing on the order, if:

- (1) The use of those proceedings in the circumstances does not violate any provision of law;
- (2) the protection of the public interest does not require the state agency to give notice and an opportunity to participate to the persons other than the parties;
- (3) based upon an investigation of the facts by the state agency, beyond receipt of the allegations, the state agency believes in good faith that the allegations will be supported to the applicable standard of proof, provided however that an alleged failure to meet the standard set forth in this subsection shall not be subject to immediate judicial review and shall not invalidate any later agency action that has been supported to the applicable standard of proof; and

(4) the order does not take effect until after the time for requesting a hearing has expired.

14. K.S.A. 65-6302(b): "Social work practice" means the professional activity of helping individuals, groups or communities enhance or restore their capacity for physical, social and economic functioning and the professional application of social work values, principles and techniques in areas such as psychotherapy, social service administration, social planning, social work consultation and social work research to one or more of the following ends: Helping people obtain tangible services; counseling with individuals, families and groups; helping communities or groups provide or improve social and health services; and participating in relevant social action. The practice of social work requires knowledge of human development and behavior; of social, economic and cultural institutions and forces; and of the interaction of all these factors. Social work practice includes the teaching of practicum courses in social work and includes the diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders as authorized under K.S.A. 65-6306 and 65-6319, and amendments thereto.

15. K.S.A. 65-6311: Grounds for suspension, limitation, condition, revocation or refusal to issue or renew license; procedure; licensure of applicant with felony conviction; requirements

(a) The board may refuse to issue, renew or reinstate a license, may condition, limit, revoke or suspend a license, may publicly or privately censure a licensee or may impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation upon a finding that a licensee or an applicant for license:

(5) has violated a provision of the social workers licensure act or one or more rules and regulations of the board.

16. K.A.R. 102-2-7: Any of the following acts by a licensee or an applicant for a social work license shall constitute unprofessional conduct:

(i) failing or refusing to cooperate in a timely manner with any request from the board for a response, information that is not obtained in the context of a confidential relationship, or assistance with respect to the board's investigation of any report of an alleged violation filed against oneself or any other applicant or professional who is required to be licensed or registered by the board. Each person taking longer than 30 days to provide the requested response, information, or assistance shall have the burden of demonstrating that the person acted in a timely manner.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

17. Licensee is in violation of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(5) and K.A.R. 102-2-7(i), in that Licensee has failed or refused to cooperate in a timely manner with a request for a response from the Board related to the Report of Alleged Violation filed against her for her failure to respond to the Board's audit.

SANCTION

WHEREFORE, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and pursuant to the authority granted by K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(5) and K.S.A. 77-537, the Complaint Review Committee of behalf of the Board finds that the Kansas Licensed Masters Social Work license of Licensee Sara E. Wood should be and is hereby **SUSPENDED** on the effective date of this Summary Proceeding Order as set forth in the Notice of Relief and the Certificate of Service below, and until such order of the Board.

Additionally, Licensee shall pay a fine of **\$250.00** within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Summary Proceeding Order to the Board's investigator at its offices located at 700 SW Harrison St., Suite 420, Topeka, KS 66603.


