CONSENT AGREEMENT AND ORDER

Now on this 17<sup>th</sup> day of NOVEMBER, 1992 the above captioned matter comes before the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, by agreement of Dana Paquette (registrant) and the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board (board) for the purpose of settling the above-captioned case.

Licensee hereby stipulates to the following:

1. Licensee is registered as a masters level psychologist and accordingly is permitted to practice psychology within the meaning of the Kansas Regulation of Psychologists Act, K.S.A. 74-5301 et seq., and amendments thereto.

2. The board received a report of information concerning registrant's conduct alleging registrant violated K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-5369(d), as defined by K.A.R. 102-4-5(2), K.A.R. 102-4-5(3) and K.A.R. 102-4-5(5).

3. The reported information, if proved to be true would constitute a violation of K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-5369(d), as defined by K.A.R. 102-4-5(2), K.A.R. 102-4-5(3) and K.A.R. 102-4-5(5).

4. The board conducted an investigation concerning registrant's alleged violation of K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-5369(d), as defined by K.A.R. 102-4-5(2), K.A.R. 102-4-5(3) and K.A.R. 102-4-5(5).

5. During the investigation, registrant was informed of the reported information and given the opportunity to respond to the allegations.

6. As a result of the investigation, the board found reasonable grounds to believe that registrant's conduct violated K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-5369(d), as defined by K.A.R. 102-4-5(2), K.A.R. 102-4-5(3) and K.A.R. 102-4-5(5).

7. Registrant denies the allegations and denies her conduct violated K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 74-5369(d) as defined by K.A.R. 102-4-5(2), K.A.R. 102-4-5(3) and K.A.R. 102-4-5(5).

Registrant and the board mutually desire to enter into this Consent Agreement and Order in lieu of adjudicative proceedings.

WHEREFOR Registrant hereby consents and agrees to the following terms and conditions:

A. Registrant waives all rights to an adjudication of facts and law which could be determined pursuant to a hearing

conducted in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act in Case No. 409.

B. Licensee waives the right to file a motion for reconsideration and all rights of appeal pursuant to the Kansas act for judicial review in Case No. 409.

C. Licensee consents to imposition of a one year suspension of her registration to practice psychology, said suspension to be immediately stayed and to remain stayed so long as Registrant complies with the terms and conditions set forth in this consent Agreement and Order.

D. Registrant consents to imposition of the one year suspension should it be established, after notice and opportunity to be heard, that Registrant violated or failed to comply with the terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement and Order.

E. Licensee further understands that any violation of the Regulation of Psychologists Act, as established at a hearing conducted in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act, will constitute a violation of this Consent Agreement and Order, thus resulting in imposition of the one year suspension.

F. Registrant consents to the following conditions of her continued practice as a registered masters level psychologist:

1. For a period of one year your psychological assessment activities shall be supervised by a licensed psychologist acceptable to the board.

2. The supervising psychologist shall review and consult with you regarding any psychological assessment activities you undertake as a registered masters level psychologist. "Psychological assessment" means the use, in any manner, of established psychological tests, procedures and techniques with the intent of diagnosing adjustment, functional, mental, vocational, or emotional problems or establishing treatment methods for persons having such problems.

3. Reports to the board are due every three (3) months from the supervising psychologist regarding these activities, with the first report due three (3) months after board approval of this Consent Agreement and Order. "Psychological assessment" means the use, in any manner, of established psychological tests, procedures and techniques with the intent of diagnosing adjustment, functional, mental, vocational, or emotional problems or establishing treatment methods for persons having such problems.

4. DR. DOUG WITT is approved to serve as the supervising psychologist.

5. The attached standard requirements are incorporated by reference.

G. Registrant consents to the submission of this Consent Agreement and Order to the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board.

H. Licensee understands that upon approval by the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, this Consent Agreement and Order becomes a final order of the board.

WHEREFORE the provisions above are consented to and are hereby made the final order of the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board.

## STANDARD PROVISIONS

The following standard provisions are incorporated in each Consent Agreement and Order by reference.

- 1) Licensee/registrant has ten (10) days from receipt of Consent Agreement and Order in which to sign and return to board office.
- 2) Licensee/registrant shall not serve as a supervisor during the time the Consent Agreement and Order is in effect.
- 3) Licensee/registrant shall be responsible for all costs incurred in satisfying the terms of the Consent Agreement and Order.
- 4) Notification of the Consent Agreement and Order agreement shall be provided to another state licensing board if the licensee/registrant is also licensed, registered, or certified in another state.
- 5) Supervisors shall not be in a subordinate or familial relationship with the licensee.
- 6) The licensee shall cooperate with his/her supervisor to enable the supervisor to discharge his/her duties in a responsible manner.
- 7) Supervisory reports shall be filed with the board prior to the board's meetings. The Executive Director of the board shall notify the supervisor when the reports are due.
- 8) The Consent Agreement and Order constitutes the entire agreement between the licensee/registrant and may be modified or amended only by written agreement signed by the parties.
