This office represents the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board. As you know, the Complaint Review Committee met in October to review the above complaint against you. The Committee found probable cause of violations of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9) on unprofessional conduct, and K.A.R. 102-2-7(b)(3) [failure to inform Board of termination], (j) [performing services clearly inconsistent or incommensurate with one's training, education and experience and within accepted professional standards for social work], (s) [failure to protect the information contained in a client's records], (t) [failure to obtain written client consent before permitting third-party observation of activities and before releasing information concerning a client], (aa) [exercising undue influence over a client] and (tt) [engaging in a dual relationship with a client].

The Board has determined the appropriate sanction on this complaint to be a Statutory Formal Censure pursuant to K.S.A. 74-7508(f). You should consider this letter to be the Formal Censure. This sanction will not affect your ability to practice bachelors level social work in Kansas.
