**SUMMARY PROCEEDING ORDER**

NOW, on this 14 day of July, 2020, the above-captioned matter comes before the Complaint Review Committee of the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board ("Board").

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Board finds that the following facts have been established by a preponderance of the evidence:

1. Alicia A. Camacho ("Respondent") was at all times relevant, a Temporary-Licensed Addiction Counselor ("T-LAC"), having been issued T-LAC License No. 1644 within the meaning of the Kansas Addiction Counselor Licensure Act, K.S.A. 65-6607, *et seq.*, and amendments thereto.
2. On or about November 5, 2019, Respondent's submitted to the Board a self-report.
3. Respondent was employed as an Intensive Outpatient Counselor at a treatment facility.

4. In her self-report, Respondent reported that she had numerous personal issues that caused her to miss numerous shifts she was scheduled to work at this treatment facility.

5. Respondent further reported that due to her continuous absences, she was terminated from her position.

6. Prior to her termination, Respondent failed to make reasonable arrangements for her clients at the treatment facility related to her absences.

#### **APPLICABLE LAW**

7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537(a) of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act ("KAPA"), a state agency may use summary proceedings, subject to a party's request for a hearing on the order, if:

- (1) The use of those proceedings in the circumstances does not violate any provision of law;
- (2) the protection of the public interest does not require the state agency to give notice and an opportunity to participate to persons other than the parties;
- (3) based upon an investigation of the facts by the state agency, beyond receipt of the allegations, the state agency believes in good faith that the allegations will be supported to the applicable standard of proof, provided however that an alleged failure to meet the standards set forth in this subsection shall not be subject to immediate judicial review and shall not invalidate any later agency action that has been supported to the applicable standard of proof; and
- (4) the order does not take effect until after the time for requesting a hearing has expired.

8. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-6608(c): "Licensed addiction counselor" means a person who engages in the practice of addiction counseling limited to substance use disorders and who is licensed under this act. Such person shall engage in the practice of addiction counseling in a state-licensed or certified alcohol and other drug treatment program or in completing a Kansas domestic violence offender assessment for participants in a certified batterer intervention program pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 75-7d01 through 75-7d13, and amendments thereto, unless otherwise exempt from licensure under K.S.A. 59-29b46(n), and amendments thereto.

9. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-6615(a)(5): The board may refuse to issue, renew or reinstate a license, may condition, limit, revoke or suspend a license, may publicly or privately censure a licensee or may impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation upon a finding that a licensee or an applicant for license has violated a provision of the addiction counselor licensure act or one or more of the rules and regulations of the board have engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by applicable rules and regulations adopted by the board. Specifically, K.A.R. 102-7-11(jj): failing to seek continuation of service, or abandoning or neglecting a client under or in need of professional care, without making reasonable arrangements for that care.


**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

10. Respondent is in violation of K.S.A. 65-6615(a)(5), as defined in K.A.R. 102-7-11(jj), in that Respondent failed to make reasonable arrangements for her clients in need of professional care.

**ORDER**

WHEREFORE, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and pursuant to the authority granted by 65-6615(a) and K.S.A. 77-537, the Complaint Review Committee of behalf of the Board finds that the Kansas T-LAC license of Respondent Alicia A. Camacho should be and is hereby **PUBLICALLY CENSORED** for her violations of the Kansas Addiction Counselor Licensure Act.
