STIPULATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered this $\frac{/8 \, \text{CL}}{}$ day of March, 1991, by and between the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board (Board) and Mark D. Goodman, Ph.D., (Licensee).

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Board has received and investigated complaint #287 in which it is alleged that the Licensee committed an act of unprofessional conduct in violation of K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 74-5324(d), as defined by K.A.R. 102-1-10(b) (25); and

WHEREAS, Licensee denies all allegations of said complaint; and

WHEREAS, the Board and Licensee mutually desire to enter into this agreement in lieu of further proceedings;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the conditions, covenants and promises contained herein, the Board and Licensee agree that:

- 1. Licensee will forward to the Board periodic reports as indicated below which demonstrate Licensee's ability to be a supervising psychologist in compliance with the statutes and regulations, particularly with respect to, but in no way limited to, K.A.R. 102-1-11(a) (8), (9) and (13).
 - a. Copies of all billings for services performed by all unlicensed assistants will be sent to the Board on a quarterly basis until the termination of this agreement, with the first report being due on 90th day following execution of this agreement, and subsequent reports being due on the last day of the month in three-month intervals. Patient names will be deleted from the reports, and all patients will be identified by their billing number.
 - b. Licensee will send to the Board copies of all supervisory logs as required by K.A.R. 102-1-11(b). The reports will be due on the same dates as the reports relating to billing. Patient names will be deleted from the logs, and all patients will be identified by their billing number.
 - c. Licensee will provide documentation demonstrating that all of the Licensee's unlicensed

> assistants are working in their area of competence established by training, education, or experience.

- If the Licensee fails to satisfy the terms of this agreement, the Board may terminate the agreement and commence an adjudicative hearing on the merits of complaint #287. agreement shall not be admitted as an admission by Licensee of any allegations of said complaint.
- Upon successful completion of this agreement, complaint #287 will be dismissed.
- This agreement terminates at midnight on June 30, unless otherwise agreed upon, or unless a breach of agreement results in commencement of an adjudicative proceeding.
- This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Board and Licensee, and may be modified or amended only in writing, signed on behalf of both Board and Licensee.
