SUMMARY PROCEEDING ORDER

NOW on this 4th day of October, 2007, the above-captioned complaint comes before the Complaint Review Committee of the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board [Board].

Findings of Fact

The Committee finds that the following facts have been established by clear and convincing evidence:

- Karen Showalter is a Licensed Bachelor Social Worker, License #5643,
 which was issued by the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board.
- 2. At all times relevant to the complaint herein, Licensee was practicing as a Licensed Bachelor Social Worker within the meaning of the Kansas Licensure of Social Workers Act, K.S.A. 65-6301 *et seq.* and amendments thereto.

- 3. Licensee was charged in McPherson County, Kansas, with nine criminal counts, including felony embezzlement from her father's estate. The Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services has further made a confirmed finding of exploitation by Licensee of her mother, the rightful heir of the proceeds of the estate.
- 4. On or about August 31, 2007, Licensee pled no contest to three counts of felony theft and was found guilty by the district court judge in McPherson County, Kansas of all allegations as charged. Sentencing is set for November 9, 2007. [Exhibit 1]

Conclusions of Law

The following conclusions of law are based on evidence the Board finds is clear and convincing:

- 1. The Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-537 provides that a state agency may use summary proceedings, subject to a party's request for a hearing on the order, if the use of the proceedings in the circumstances does not violate any provision of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the state agency to give notice and an opportunity to participate to persons other than the parties.
- 2. The actions of Licensee Karen Showalter violate K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(1) as well as K.S.A. 21-3701(a)(1) Felony Theft.

Sanction

Based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Complaint Review Committee finds pursuant to K.S.A. 65-6311 and K.S.A. 77-537 that the

Bachelor Social Worker license of Licensee Karen Showalter should be Kansas suspended indefinitely until further order of this Committee.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
